
Key Messages

The citizens' debate in Thessaloniki started with welcome addresses from Apostolos Tzitzikostas, Markku Markkula and Ilias Kouskouvelis, followed by a keynote speech from the President of the Hellenic Republic, Prokopis Pavlopoulos.

After this introduction, the debate between more than 400 citizens and the three speakers covered, for more than two hours, a wide range of topics including, amongst others: the need to bring the EU closer to its citizens, notably young people; the decentralisation of power to regional and local authorities; the absorption of EU funds by cities and regions; EU enlargement and integration; the role of the EU in the world as a major player (cultural diplomacy, peace, etc.); the importance of culture and cultural tourism in Greece and the EU; austerity measures and the economic situation of Greece; the prevention of and response to terrorism; the deficit of knowledge about the EU among citizens, lack of communication and information; the need to better promote EU's success stories; EU support to entrepreneurs, SMEs and investors.

The debate was rich in content and enabled a direct and open dialogue between citizens and their political representatives.

Reflecting on Europe: Follow-Up

The Reflecting on Europe online survey, the CoR's feedback mechanism to report the main concerns and ideas of citizens in local events, was promoted during the local event and on social media in Greece, and generated over 3,600 engagement (likes, shares, comments) and more than 500 responses. A total of 14,000 persons were reached. The results collected during the series of events taking place all over the EU in 2017 will contribute to feed the CoR opinion on the future of Europe that will be approved in 2018.
