

European Projects

- TONETA / Europe for Citizens (2011 2013): promote the celebration of European events to share knowledge among the citizens.
- The Migrants Encyclopedia / Erasmus + (2014 2017): creation of an encyclopedia that gather 400 testimonies of migrants around 8 Atlantic cities to share the experiences among citizens.
- PREVENT (2012-2014) and 2nd Chance (2016-2018) / URBACT: projects from the URBACT programme where the partners have to create a Local Group involving different actors from the cities to participate in the elaboration of a Local Action Plan connected with the topic of the project.
- The impact of the Euroscepticism on the construction of Europe / Europe for Citizens
 (2017 2019).

What does the project consist? 1/3

On the one hand, the project aims to **engage citizens of six EU cities to understand the European Union**, in order to acquire a basic knowledge of its institutions, history, achievements and its multilevel governance approach.



What does the project consist? 2/3

On the other hand, the project wants to promote an understanding and discussion of the reasons behind the current raise of euroscepticism and its impact on the future of the European project. The project wants to go in depth about the origins and consequences of the Euroescepticim in the actual European stage.



What does the project consist? 3/3

Moreover, this project has a goal to **contribute to improve** the understanding of EU, image, promotion of citizen participation, European Citizenship, identity, as well as tolerance and understanding of the different European countries.

MOOC Courses

First MOOC - focused on:

- -European History;
- European values;
- Human Rights;
- European Citizen Rights;
- -European Institutions and their activities and the main achievements of the EU.
- -Euroscepticism (origin and consequences).
- Future of Europe in the global world.

Second MOOC - First MOOC - focused on:

- Debate about the topics treated in the national and transnational events.
- Globalization.
- -Immigration.
- -Euroscepticism (origins and consequences);
- -Future of Europe in the current framework.
- -National elections and their impact in European Affairs, European policies and European Affairs.
- -2019 European elections.

Participa.gijon.es Platform

The opening of an online platform about participation that allows the citizenship to participate in the project (debates about the MOOC course or any other European affair that be relevant for the population).



Citizen Dialogues

Citizen dialogue among the participants of the debate and representatives of the local, regional, national and European institutions invited.

The **achievements** of the events are: Improve the global knowledge about Europe; Promote the citizen debate among citizens from different cities and countries; Boost the intercultural dialogue and perspectives about European issues; Promote the participation of citizens with disadvantaged circumstances (discrimination on grounds of sex, racial, or ethnic origin, religion or belief, disability, etc).

Expected mid/long-term effects

Mid – term

Improve citizens' knowledge and understanding about the EU affairs.

Engage them to become involved and active with **citizen participation** in local and European issues.

Raise awareness of the increase of euroscepticism and its impact in the future of the European Union and their lives.

Disseminate what they have learnt and motivate more citizens about **the importance of citizen participation** and the European affairs for every citizen.

Long - term

Continuation of the collaboration of the partnership with the same topic developing and deepening more on these topics (with or without EU Funds), or on the other hand with other relevant topics (for example sectoral topics such as environment, mobility, social services, youth, sustainable development, etc).
