Who is taking part in the dialogue?

The dialogue will be attended by around 90 randomly selected citizens from country A, country B, country C, country D and country E. Randomly selection ensures that the composition is very diverse in terms of age, gender, educational standard and country of origin.

You do not need any special previous knowledge for the Digital Citizens' Dialogue. It's all about you bringing your everyday experience and your ideas into the conversations. All you need is a computer or laptop with stable internet access, a microphone and a webcam.

How does cooperation work in transnational citizens' groups?

Meetings and discussions in the large group (plenary session) take place with all 90 citizens from country A, country B, country C, country D and country E. The small groups are tri-national and work with citizens from two other countries.

How will the participants communicate with each other?

You speak in your own language. Interpreters ensure good communication.

What organizational matters are still important?

Participation is free of charge for you. You will receive an expense allowance of 125 € for participating.

You will need to participate in a PC or laptop with a webcam, microphone, speakers and a stable internet connection. For better comprehensibility, using a headset is ideal!
